THE PRESENTATION OF THE LORD (CANDLEMAS): TUESDAY 2nd FEBRUARY

On Tuesday the Catholic Church celebrates the Feast of **the Presentation of the Lord** which occurs forty days after the birth of Jesus and is also known as **Candlemas Day**, since the blessing and procession of candles is included in today's Liturgy. According to the 1962 Missal of St. John XXIII the Extraordinary Form of the Roman Rite, today is referred to as

THE "PURIFICATION OF MARY."

In obedience to the Old Law, the Lord Jesus, the first-born, was presented in the Temple by His Blessed Mother and His foster Father. This is another 'Epiphany' celebration insofar as the Christ Child is revealed as the Messiah through the canticle and words of Simeon and the testimony of Anna the prophetess. Christ is the Light of the nations, hence the blessing and procession of candles on this day.

"Now Master, let Your servant go in peace, according to Your Promise, for my eyes have seen the salvation, ... the Light to enlighten the pagans, and the glory of Your people Israel!"

THE BLESSING OF THE THROATS: Wednesday 3rd February 2021

The Blessing of the Throats is celebrated on the 3rd February, the Feast day of St. Blaise of Sebaste. St. Blaise was the Bishop of Sebaste in Armenia during the Fourth Century. According to various accounts he was a physician before becoming a Bishop. His religion spread throughout the entire Church in the Middle Ages because he was reputed to have miraculously cured a little boy who nearly died because of a fishbone in his throat. From the Eighth Century he has been invoked on behalf of the sick, especially those afflicted with illnesses of the throat.
