



Pastoral Message for the Launch of CARITAS Southwark

Dear brothers and sisters in Christ

I greet you in the name of the Lord Jesus as we continue our Lenten journey towards Holy Week and Easter. In this joyful season of renewal we seek the living water who is Christ himself. With the Samaritan woman in today's Gospel, we believe the Lord Jesus offers every person the gift of eternal life. He shows us that no one is beyond God's love; not you or me; not our neighbour; not the unknown stranger in our midst. The Lord Jesus asks us to be God's love for others, especially those in most need.

Today, I share with you the wonderful news that we are about to launch CARITAS Southwark. Caritas is the Latin word for love and CARITAS Southwark will be our Archdiocesan network to coordinate our practical loving service of others, putting faith into ac-

tion.

Pope Francis said: '... there is an inseparable bond between our faith and the poor. May we never abandon them.' (EG 48) CARITAS Southwark will work with our parishes and schools to support them in serving those in need.
